



City receives Open Space grant funding

Funds will be used for the acquisition of Duncan Park and Belleview Park improvements

The City of Englewood recently received \$387,300 in grant funding from the Arapahoe County Open Space, Parks, and Trails Grant program. The funds will be used to purchase Duncan Park from Englewood Schools and to build a new shelter at Belleview Park.

Duncan Park Earlier this year, the City of Englewood negotiated an agreement for the purchase of Duncan Park from Englewood Schools, contingent on the receipt of this grant funding. The Englewood School District owned the property, but had leased it to the City of Englewood. Our Parks crews have maintained it as a neighborhood park since 1978. The School Board had identified the property as surplus, and the City of Englewood wanted to ensure that the property would remain a neighborhood park. City officials worked with the School Board to arrange the purchase.

Belleview Park The 2006 Parks and Recreation Master Plan identified replacement of the shelters at Belleview Park as a top priority.

Grant funds will be used to construct a new shelter to replace the 40-year-old Shelter No. 1 with a state-of-the-art ADA compliant shelter.

The Arapahoe County Open Space, Parks and Trails Grant funding is made possible by the Open Space tax that Arapahoe County voters approved in November, 2003.

Message from City Council

Recent events have led me to a renewed and personal appreciation for the excellent medical facilities that we enjoy, though often take for granted, in Englewood.

Craig Hospital is world-renowned for its research efforts and rehabilitation of patients suffering from spinal cord and traumatic brain injuries. Last year, patients from 48 states and several foreign countries sought treatment at Craig. Since *US News and World Report* initiated the “Top Ten Rehabilitation Hospitals” rating 18 years ago, Craig has consistently made the list. The hospital is currently celebrating its 100th anniversary year.

Swedish Hospital, founded in 1905, is another of Englewood’s excellent health-care facilities. Swedish is a Level I Trauma Center, serving as the region’s referral center for neurotrauma, and is a recognized leader in the treatment of strokes. Swedish also specializes in cancer care, cardiac care, emergency services, orthopedics, spine care, and services for women and children.

Still closer to home, the **Julia Temple Center** for Alzheimer’s and dementia care, originally established in 1911, has proven invaluable to my own family. I recently helped my elderly aunt relocate from Omaha, where she was bedridden and diagnosed as terminal. After only three weeks under Julia Temple care, she is walking, eating solid foods, interacting with staff and fellow patients, and once again recognizing family members. I have been unfailingly impressed by the assistance and support provided by each and every member of their team.

Along with these long-established institutions, new health-care providers continue to locate in Englewood, one of which is the **Metro Community Provider Network** clinic. This organization provides medical, dental, and mental health services to low-income individuals and families who might not otherwise have access to quality medical care.

All these institutions, and many others, make Englewood one of the best communities in the state for healthcare. Many thanks to all these providers – institutions, physicians, nurses, and staff alike. They care for us all and immeasurably enrich the city of Englewood in the process.

Interested in running for City Council?

There's still time to declare your candidacy

During the November 6, 2007 General Municipal Election, Englewood voters will elect four City Council Members: one representative from District 1, one from District 3, and two At-Large.

If you are interested in running for City Council and meet the criteria below, contact the City Clerk's Office at 303-762-2407 for details on how to declare your candidacy and other information you should know about campaigning.

Criteria

To be eligible for the office of City Council Member, residents must meet the following criteria at the time of the election:

- Must be a United States citizen;
- Must be at least 25 years of age;
- Must be a registered elector of the City of Englewood (and must have been one for one year immediately preceding the election);

- District candidates must be residents and registered electors of their districts; and
- No member of the Council shall hold any other public office or employment for which compensation is paid from any municipality.

Information Packets

Residents interested in running for City Council may pick up a Candidate Information Packet beginning July 2, 2007 in the City Clerk's Office (on the third floor of the Englewood Civic Center, 1000 Englewood Parkway).

Nomination Process

Each candidate must be nominated by petition signed by at least 50 registered electors residing within the municipality, or the district, from which the officer is to be elected.

The petitioning process takes place from August 7 through August 27.

Important Candidate Timelines

- **July 2:** Candidate Information packets available in the City Clerk's Office.
- **August 7 through 27:** Nomination petitions may be circulated.
- **August 27 at 5 pm:** Nomination petitions are due.

Nomination petitions are due August 27, 2007 at 5 pm. Only petitions obtained from the City Clerk's Office may be circulated.

Police warn of suspicious door-to-door sales tactics

Englewood Police want residents to be aware of a current scheme involving door-to-door sales of alarm systems and other products.

The Police have received numerous complaints regarding door-to-door salespeople attempting to sell these types of systems to residents. According to the complaints, the salespeople are using high-pressure sales tactics. Some are telling citizens that the City of Englewood is implementing a new policy requiring citizens to convert to the enhanced technology offered in their service packages. *This is not true.*

Door-to-door sales are not illegal, but the vendors must be properly licensed through the City of Englewood. They must have a

direct seller's license that contains the salesperson's name, personal descriptors, picture, and the dates the license is valid.

Police are working to advise the companies involved of the licensing requirements. Failure to obtain the proper licensing will result in the salesperson receiving a citation into Municipal Court if the seller is contacted by Police.

If you encounter a suspicious salesperson, please report it to the Englewood Police non-emergency dispatch line at 303-762-2438.
