



Englewood receives open space funding

The City of Englewood recently received over \$950,000 in Open Space funding from Arapahoe County. This funding comes from the Arapahoe County Open Space Tax that voters approved in 2003.

Englewood's portion of the Arapahoe County Open Space distribution for 2008 amounted to over \$700,000. In past years, the City has used these Open Space funds to help with the acquisition of Duncan Park and for other projects like the recent Belleview Park improvements.

The 2008 funding will be used for projects like the flower bed program, irrigation system upgrades in the parks, and resurfacing of tennis and basketball courts.

Arapahoe County also awarded Englewood an Open Space, Parks, and Trails Grant in the amount of \$250,000 to be used for the Platte River Bike and Pedestrian Trail Bridges Project. These bridges will cross the South Platte River at Oxford and at Dartmouth, making it easier – and safer – for pedestrians and bicyclists to access the

Mary Carter Greenway Trail along South Platte River.

During the ceremony, Arapahoe County also honored the South Platte Working Group, which works to protect open space along the South Platte River. Englewood is a member of the group, along with many other Arapahoe County communities, districts, foundations, and boards dedicated to open space endeavors.

Message from City Council

It has been a very interesting and busy eight months since I took office as your District 3 City Council representative. The more I learn about what is going on in Englewood, the more eager I am to work to balance what is good for the city and what is good for the individual. This process has been made easier with the help of the city staff, the employees of Englewood, the citizens, and my fellow council members.

There are many matters that will shape the future of Englewood in the next year. The economic base must continue to grow or maintain the pace at which it is growing. The city's services must remain at the same level of expectation for all citizens.

The Santa Fe corridor will be an important factor in the near future. As the River Point development opens in Sheridan, we must market Englewood businesses to these new customers in our area. The city will also need to monitor the traffic patterns and ensure that the city streets are handling this new traffic influx. We must also work together with the merchants on the south end of Broadway on concerns, improvements, and future needs.

There are many housing opportunities coming online: the Kent Place development is on track; the Housing Authority's Terraces on Pennsylvania will add new housing amenities in Englewood; and continued rehab and reconstruction of houses throughout the city will continue to add new housing availability.

We must also partner with Englewood Public Schools to ensure that the school system stays healthy and grows.

On the recreation front, Englewood Parks and Recreation continues to take the lead in developing great programs. The renovated golf course, Broken Tee, will be a definite asset to the city. The park system is top grade, and the Recreation Center and Malley Center have award-winning programs for all ages. I encourage you to take advantage of all the programs Parks and Recreation has to offer.

Finally, I encourage all citizens to take a personal responsibility for helping keep Englewood beautiful by complying with the city's property maintenance requirements. If you know a neighbor who needs help mowing his or her lawn, consider assisting. If you can't keep your property at a satisfactory level, there are city programs that can help. Call the Malley Center at 303-762-2660 for information on the "Rent-A-Worker" program or for a list of volunteers who may be able to help.

I urge all citizens of Englewood to get involved with what is happening in their city. Take pride in being a resident and encourage others to do the same. 

Garage Sale Guidelines

As we head into the summer season, Englewood's Code Enforcement Division would like to offer these friendly reminders about garage sales and yard sales.

Sale Restrictions

- Only two garage sales are allowed per year at the same location.
- A garage sale may last for a maximum of three days.
- Only the person having control of the entire property may conduct a garage sale.

Garage Sale Signs

The signs used to advertise the garage sale must meet the following requirements:

- Maximum size: 18" X 18"
- The sign must include the address of the person holding the garage sale and the date of the sale.
- Signs may not be attached to traffic light poles, stop signs, or any other traffic control device or municipal utility pole.
- Signs must not obstruct the view of traffic or hinder municipal operations.
- The maximum number of days a sign can be posted is three days before the date of the sale.
- The sign must be removed the day after the sale.

Arapahoe County to offer prescription drug discount card

Arapahoe County is introducing a discount card program to help consumers cope with the high price of prescription drugs. The county has partnered with the National Association of Counties (NACo) to make free prescription drug discount cards available to residents. The cards will offer average savings of 20 percent off retail price.

The cards will be available mid-July and may be used by all Arapahoe County residents, regardless of age, income, or existing health care coverage. Many of the county's pharmacies will accept the NACo card, and a national network of more than 57,000 participating retail pharmacies will also honor it.

There is no cost to taxpayers. The cards will be available at various County buildings and the City of

Englewood will also help distribute them. The discount cards will be available in the Englewood Community Development Department, located on the third floor of the Englewood Civic Center, 1000 Englewood Parkway during regular office hours (8 am to 5 pm, Monday through Friday, holidays excepted).

The cards will offer average savings of 20 percent off retail price.

Keep Englewood Beautiful has also agreed to distribute the cards at their Dump Days coupon distribution events (see schedule above).

The discount card program is administered by Caremark Rx, Inc. Arapahoe County residents can call 1-877-321-2652 toll-free or visit www.caremark.com/naco for assistance with the program. 

With the Primary and General Elections just around the corner, the Arapahoe County Clerk and Recorder's Office is gearing up for what is expected to be the highest election turnout ever.

Are you ready to vote? You can check your voter registration online at (www.arapahoevotes.com) to make sure your information is current. If you have moved since the last election, you will need to contact the Arapahoe County Clerk's office to update your address. If you want to change your party affiliation, that can be done by downloading and completing the form and sending it to the Arapahoe County Clerk's office. You can also call 303-795-4511 to request a form.

Permanent Mail-in Ballots

Nancy Doty, Arapahoe County Clerk and Recorder, is urging voters to sign up for permanent mail-in ballots. Most Arapahoe County voters have received an application in the mail, but you can also get this information from the website (www.arapahoevotes.com) or by calling 303-795-4511.
