## 2010 Census to begin in March *Make sure you are counted!*

The U.S. Census Bureau is getting ready for the 2010 Census – a complete count of every person who lives in the United States. The Census count helps decide the amount of federal funding for services like schools, hospitals, and highway improvements. It also determines the number of seats each state has in the U.S. House of Representatives.


For both these reasons, it is critical for everyone who lives in America to participate. Englewood’s Mayor, Jim Woodward, wants to make sure that every Englewood resident is counted.

“Complete participation in the Census is critical to our future,” said Mayor Woodward. “I encourage all Englewood residents to fill out and return their Census questionnaire to help ensure that we receive our fair share and are able to provide

the services our community needs.”

To help make sure we get a complete count of Englewood residents, the Census Bureau has set up assistance centers at three Englewood facilities: the Library, the Malley Center, and the Englewood Recreation Center. These Census Assistance Centers will be staffed with Census officials who can answer questions, provide Census questionnaires to people who may not have received one, help people fill out their form, and in some cases, provide translation services.



## Englewood Community Garden moving forward this spring

Over the past year, a steering committee of interested citizens has worked with the City of Englewood, the Cultural Arts Commission, and Denver Urban Gardens to bring a community garden to Englewood. As a result of everyone's efforts, the plan is to have a community garden in place by late spring.

The garden will be located adjacent to the Englewood Depot site on the corner of West Dartmouth Avenue and South Fox Street, just north of Cushing Park.

The Englewood Community Garden committee's mission is to enable members of our

community to share in the popular activity of gardening and to work together to organically grow fruits, vegetables, and some flowers. The garden will also provide additional green space where community members can enjoy nature's beauty.

The garden plots will be 12'X12' and will be available for a \$25 plot fee and a refundable \$25 Work Deposit. Half plots and a few raised beds will also be available. Gardeners will be expected to participate in a few scheduled volunteer work days throughout the year.

Residents interested in applying for a garden plot are invited to attend an informational meeting on Tuesday, March 2 from 6:30 to 7:30 pm in Hampden Hall, 1000 Englewood Parkway, 2nd floor. This meeting will provide an overview of the garden plans and information on the application process.

## Spring safety tips From the Fire Department

The Englewood Fire Department recommends adding the following safety suggestions to your spring cleaning "to do" list:

**Check your wiring and outlets:** Overloaded circuits and extension cords pose a fire threat. Replace frayed wires or cords. If you see overloaded wall sockets, remove some of the cords and find a new outlet for them. Remove cords running under carpeting and check all rooms to make sure no cords are trapped against walls where heat can build up.

**Add smoke alarm maintenance to your spring cleaning list:** Remember to replace your batteries at least once a year and make sure your smoke alarm is free from dust and debris.

**Take care with springtime lawn and garden chores:** Lawnmowers and other garden power tools can be dangerous. Always dress appropriately for the task and make sure the safety devices on the equipment are functioning properly. Remove any objects in your path (such as sticks, glass, or metal) that can cause injury and damage equipment. Always unplug tools before making adjustments or clearing jams near moving parts. Never use electric power tools in wet or damp conditions and make sure your equipment has a ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI). Also, check to make sure your extension cords are in good condition, are rated for outdoor use, and are the proper gauge wire for the electrical current capacity of the tool.



The moratorium will remain in place until the matter is reviewed and appropriate zoning regulations are adopted. The current moratorium will end in June of 2010.
