WHEREAS, in accordance with ordinances numbered three and four of the City of Englewood, finally passed and approved on the 8th day of August, A.D. 1932, in accordance with the laws of the State of Colorado, the following questions were submitted to the properly qualified taxpaying electors of said city for their determination at an election duly called and regularly held in said city on the 2nd day of September, A.D. 1932, said questions being as follows, to-wit:

Shall waterworks ordinance No.3, of the City of Englewood, Colorado, adopted and approved on the 8th day of August, A.D. 1932, adopting a plan for acquiring a waterworks system for said city be approved?

Shall electric light and power plant ordinance No.4, of the City of Englewood, Colorado, adopted and approved on the 8th day of August, A.D. 1932, adopting a plan for acquiring an electric light and power plant and electrical distribution system for said city be approved?

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the question of the approval of said ordinances numbered three and four, as hereinafter set forth, has been duly submitted to a vote of the duly qualified taxpaying electors of the City of Englewood at the municipal election duly called and regularly held in said City of Englewood on the 2nd day of September A.D. 1932; that a majority of all the votes cast upon the question first hereinabove set forth was in favor of the approval of said ordinance No.3 as aforesaid and, therefore, it is hereby declared that said election resulted in favor of said question; that a majority of all the votes cast upon the question of approval of ordinance No. 4 hereinabove set forth was in favor of the approval of said ordinance






